The office of U.S. Senator J. Bennett Johnston has brought your product TEMP-COAT™ to our attention and suggested that we invite you to participate in this year's National Weatherization Conference. Every year, the U.S. Department of Energy sponsors a conference for the 50 States and the District of Columbia, which operate Weatherization Programs through 1,200 local agencies. We expect over 350 people to attend the 1993 Conference scheduled for September 14-16, in Phoenix, Arizona. The state of Arizona, as host of this year's conference, is organizing an exhibitor's fair at the conference with space available for demonstration of products and services which benefit the Weatherization Program. The \$450 cost for exhibit space includes a display booth for the entire conference as well as meal tickets. I have asked Ms. Betty McColley of the Energy Conservation and Education Program, Arizona Energy Office, who is coordinating this aspect of the conference, to write directly to you providing more details.
